Professor Shaun Gregory is a leading expert on Pakistan and its security. Presently Head of the Pakistan Security Research Unit at the Department of Peace Studies at the University of Bradford, his main areas of research are French and South Asian security issues respectively.

Shaun was Visiting Professor at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques at Sciences-Po in Paris in 2006. His research in France is focussed on the Anglo-French nuclear relationship and on the role of France in the US-led "War on Terrorism".

The author of numerous books and articles on security, Shaun's portfolio includes studies of nuclear stability in South Asia, nuclear command and control in Pakistan, the ISI and the War on Terrorism, and the treatment of the Christian community in Pakistan. His latest book is *Pakistan: Securing the Insecure State*, published in January 2009

However, Shaun's passion has in recent years been on South Asia nuclear and security issues with a particular focus on Pakistan. Shaun was Director of the South Asian Strategic Stability Unit between February 2004 and February 2006 before the SASSU contract came to an end at the University of Bradford. He is presently researching nuclear command and control in Pakistan, Pakistan's role in the war on terrorism, the treatment of Christians in Pakistan, and Pakistan's security issues more broadly for a book-length study published by Routledge in 2007.

Shaun is widely consulted by the media in the UK, France, and beyond, and has offered policy advice to many Governments and their agencies
